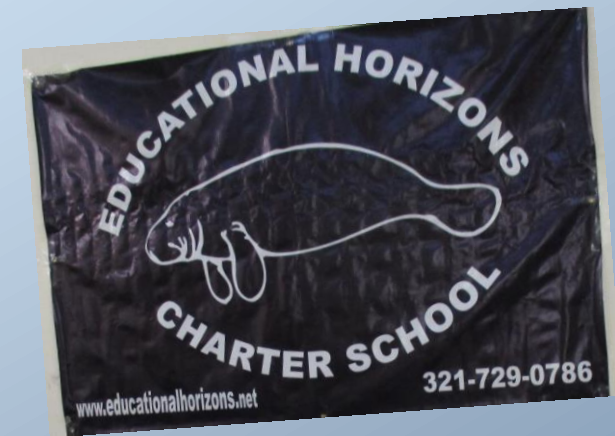

2020-21 School Year Re-opening Plan



Florida schools re-opening options



- DOE ORDER NO. 2020-EO-06
- All Florida schools **must** open as a 'brick and mortar' environment in August 2020 to serve their school population
- Schools and districts **may** select an Optional Innovative Reopening Plan that fits the guidelines of the directive which could allow home learning
- As a charter school, our plan **must** be received and approved by BPS before July 31, 2020
- Our school plan has been approved and if filed with the district
- Plans will be in effect until end of December 2020 (at this time)



Options for 2020-21

- Option #1- Traditional Learning Model at school address – this will look similar to our regular school but have increased attention to health and safety protocols as suggested under CDC and DOH



- Option #2 – eLearning from the home environment – this will be closely monitored by family who will need to give assistance to keep student on task

Practices in common for **both** Options

- Meet five days a week beginning August 24, 2020 and ending June 3, 2021
- Follow a schedule designed by teachers/administrator in the 8:00 to 4:00 day
- Use both digital and print materials
- Experience interactions and instruction with certified teachers
- Have time for collaboration and independent work
- Receive support and instruction in line with IEP's, EP's, health plans, 504 plans, and ELL plans by qualified personnel
- Have monitoring for annual yearly progress regularly with equity
- Have attendance taken throughout the day
- Be expected to follow school rules and code of civility as outlined in student handbook
- Complete all classwork and missing assignment due to absences in a timely manner



Practices for Option #1 -Traditional

- Instruction will be face to face with technology integrated into day
- Students will wear school uniform which will include a mask as mandated with BPS policy (Fridays will be a dress down day, appropriate for learning)
- No student will be allowed to stay on campus if ill and may be subjected to temperature checks and wellness survey
- Desks and work areas will be arranged to maximize social distancing
- Frequent cleaning, sanitizing, and hand washing will be part of day
- Classrooms will be equipped with A/C purification systems and portable UV lights for evening use
- Visitors and volunteer will not be permitted on campus nor in classrooms
- Common materials will be sanitized between uses
- Tier 2 and 3 interventions will occur face to face throughout the week
- Students will not share personal materials (including birthday treats and food items)
- NO visitors for lunch and no late deliveries of lunch (Mypaymentplus is the preferred lunch payment method)



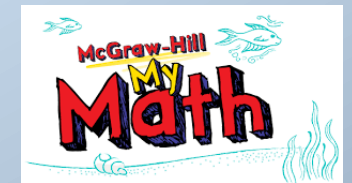
Practice for Option #2 - eLearning

- Instruction will be given digitally through Google Suite classrooms
- Students will need a Gmail account which reflects their name for recognitions with parental controls, NO silly or nicknames to be added
- Students will need access to reliable technology at home
- Supplies will be kept at home for use
- School materials will be picked up for use at home and returned at end of learning
- Students will have scheduled times to be on campus for progress monitoring and assessments
- ESE services as well as Tier 2 and 3 interventions will occur through online platform and through technology
- Activities may look different yet hold same rigor as traditional settings
- Students will have option of uniform or dress down, must be appropriate for learning
- Lunch will be picked up from Meadowlane at designated time

Additional safety measures and practices for this year include...

- School will be provided with PPE including face masks, shields, cleaning products, gloves, disposable masks, thermometers
- Training will be held during pre-planning and throughout the year to assist teachers and staff
- Rooms will be cleaned nightly
- Posters and markings will be utilized to help with guidance
- Students will stay in room, teachers travel
- Arrivals and dismissals will be staggered
- Lunch will be outside and spaced seating
- All water fountains will be capped, students will use personal water bottles
- Parents will be given a choice at beginning of year and will adhere to this choice until December, changes made through administration when petitioned
- No walk up traffic to classrooms
- No admittance into office during school day
- All extra curricular activities, meetings, social events, gathering, and field trips will be virtual or postponed this year
- All food items will be grab and go



Ill and sick students and employees...

- All students and staff are expected to check temperature before coming on campus
- A temperature of 100 degree Fahrenheit will warrant leaving campus
- Isolation area will be utilized for individuals
- No one will be admitted back until 24 hours of fever free without medication
- COVID positive must isolate at home for 10-14 days and be symptom free to return
- Ill students will continue with education in the same platform they have been using
- For a COVID positive case, families will be notified and areas sanitized before use
- Education will continue at home under supervision of teachers until areas cleaned as needed
- NO personal information about cases will be given - due to HIPAA laws



Parent Responsibilities

- Sign a Declaration of Intent for the semester until December 2020
- Set up an area at home for school and maintain supplies
- Pick up materials at campus on designated time slot (August 20th at 10:00am)
- Keep students on task and logged into all meetings and classes as scheduled
- Bring students to campus as scheduled for progress monitoring
- Monitor attendance, call school when absent
- Monitor students but allow independent work, allow them to do tasks
- Order and pick up lunch if needed through Meadowlane, payment on mypaymentplus
- Create an email for each student with recognizable characters and NO silly names, add parent controls if warranted
- Install Google classroom as directed by teachers on reliable device

Teacher Responsibilities

- Maintain certification for subjects are areas taught, continue for professional development to meet needs of this year's students
- Deliver quality lessons using state standards as guidelines and follow pacing and sequencing for both groups of students
- Use progress monitoring to measure student growth
- Communicate with students and parents daily and complete progress reports 3 times a year, and interim reports 3 times a year
- Be available when students are not present for conferences virtually or by phone during school hours of 8:00 to 4:00 (by appointment)
- Promote safe practices with self and students



Student Responsibilities

- Be prepared daily and dressed for learning
- Be an active learner and participate
- Ask for help when needed
- Complete all assignments in a timely manner, work independently, re-do assignments if directed
- Follow school rules and codes of conduct
- Promote health and safety practices as presented by CDC and DOH
- Be respectful to self, teachers, and peers



Social Emotional Needs

- Through our Montessori training, we know to focus on the whole child
- Conscious Discipline will help us to work with trauma and teach problem solving
- Social and emotion needs will be considered in all aspects of learning and part of our School Improvement Plan
